

## Meet the Teacher

### 3<sup>rd</sup> – 5<sup>th</sup> Grade

1. Ms. Garcia’s class has 31 students. All students are either 8 or 9 years old. How many students are 9 years old if 26 of the students are 8 years old? Use words and numbers to support your answer.

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2. There are 4 classrooms of 4<sup>th</sup> grade students. Table 1 shows the number of students in each classroom.

**Table 1: 4<sup>th</sup> Grade Classrooms**

Room Number	207	208	209	210
Number of Students	32	34	31	33

Is there a better way to divide the 4<sup>th</sup> grade students more evenly between all 4 rooms? Use words and numbers to support your decision.

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3. Ms. Garcia has 32 students in her classroom. She wants to make pods of desks with either 4 or 6 students in each pod. How many pods do you recommend she have in her class? Use words and numbers to support your answer.

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
